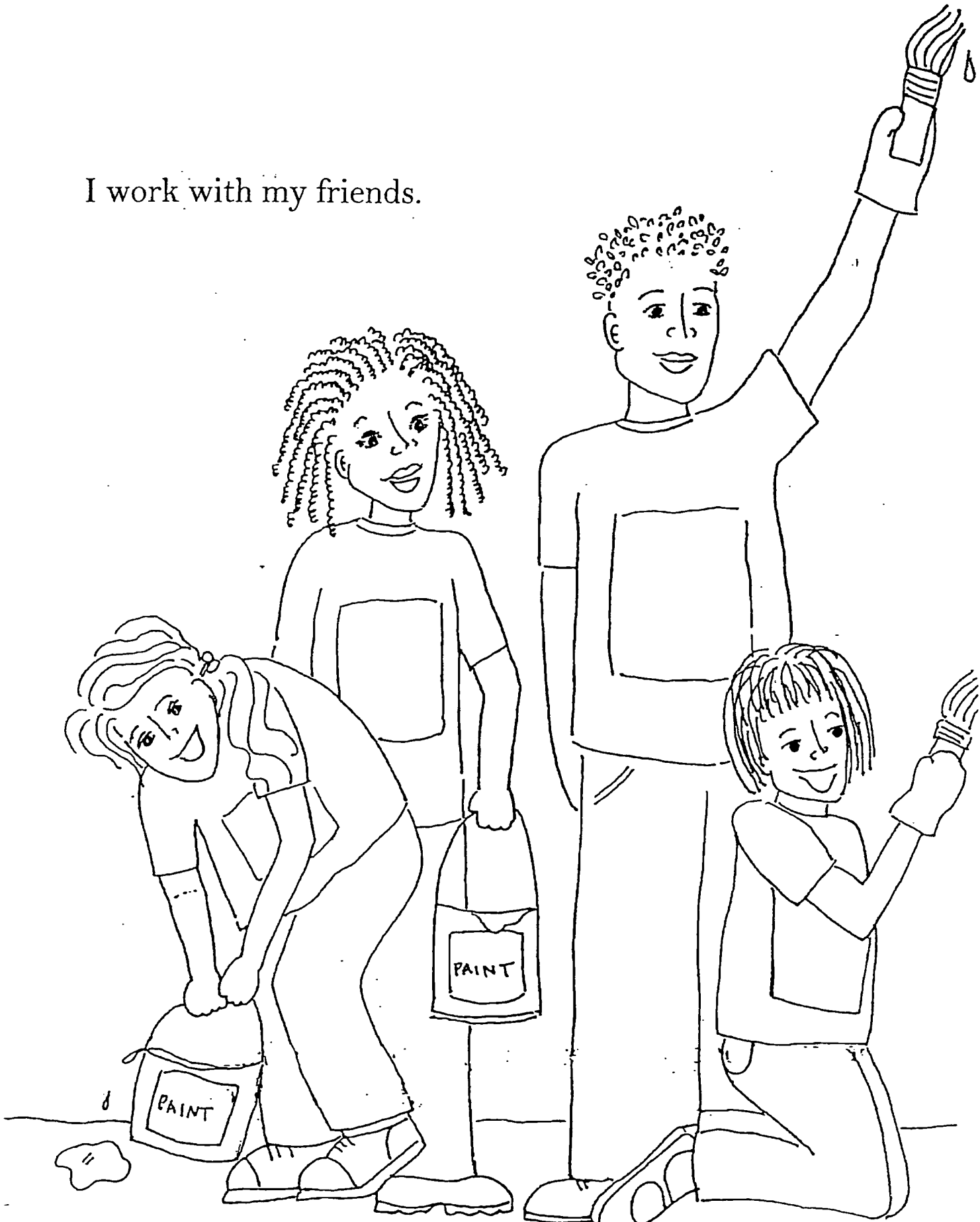

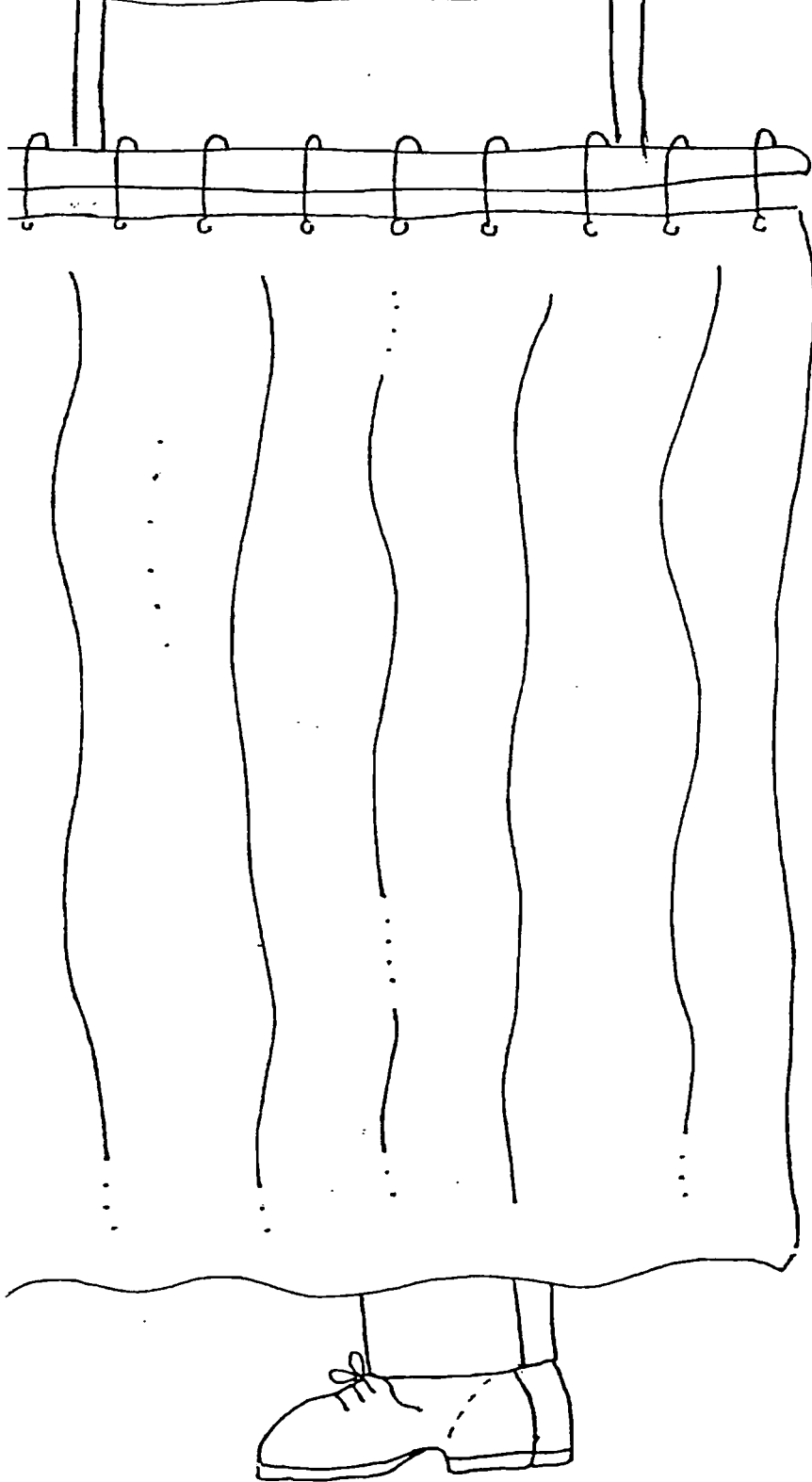

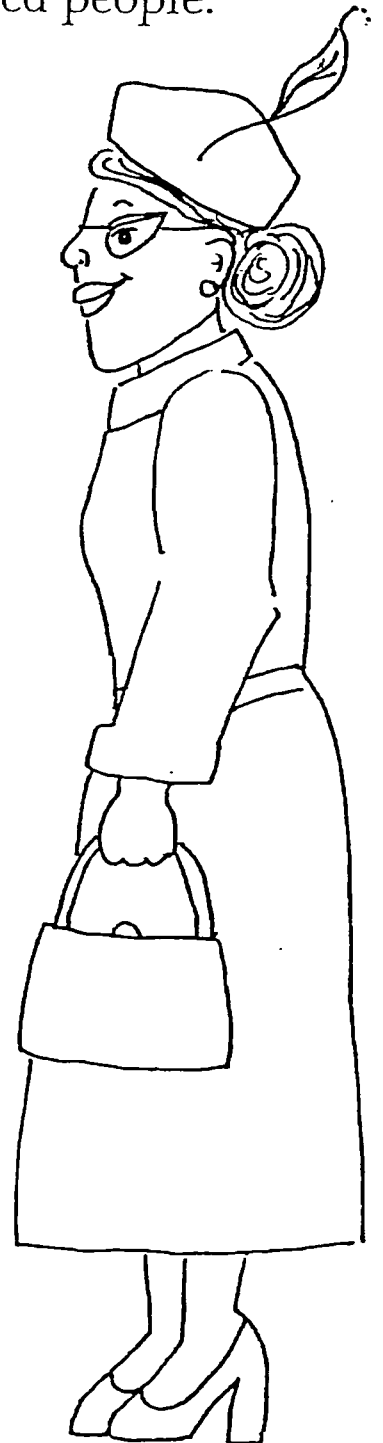

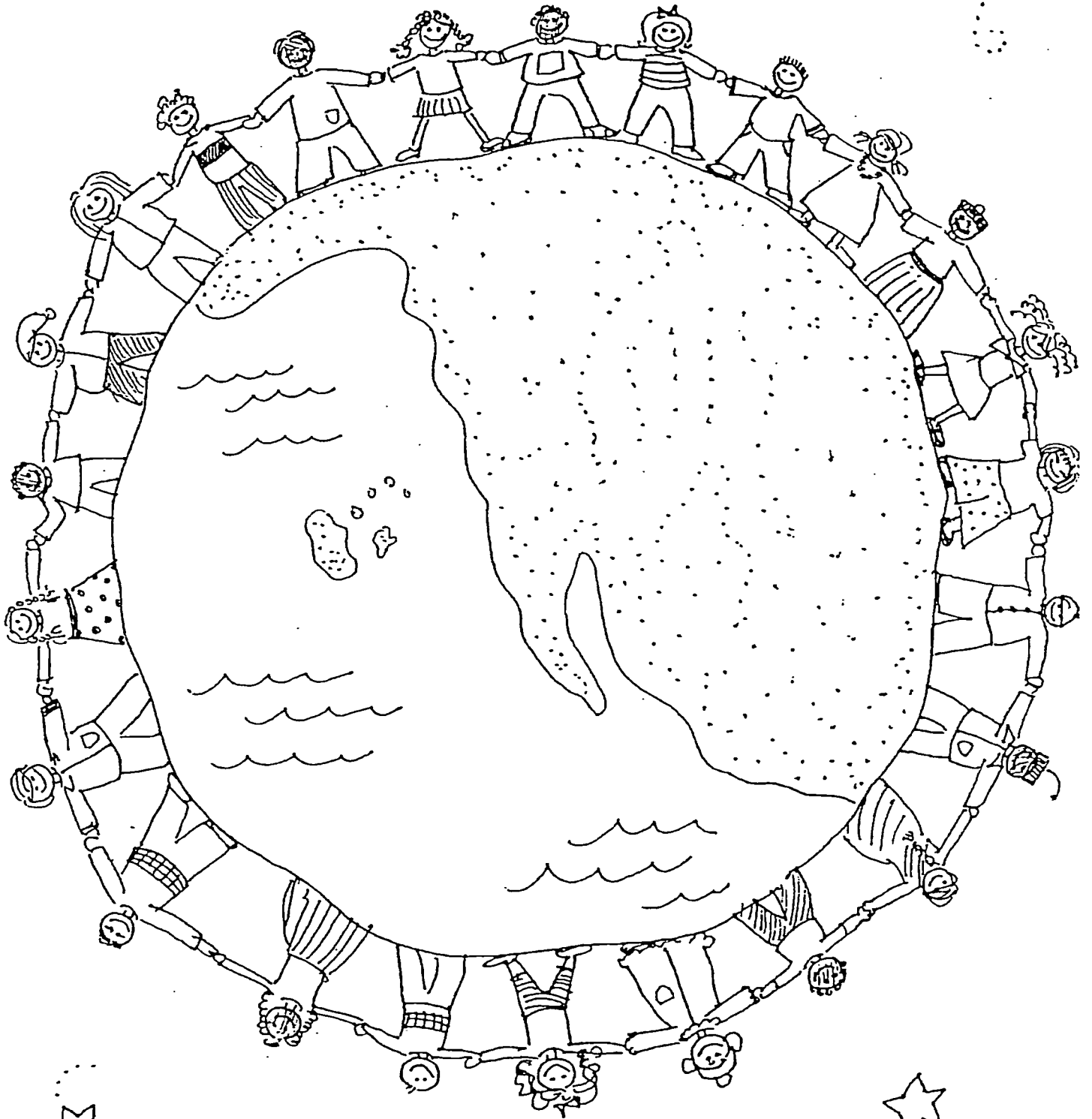

A NOTE TO MARTIN LUTHER KING DAY OF SERVICE PROJECT COORDINATORS

The following pages may be used for additional activities:

I have a dream...

This page may be used by children to draw illustrations of their dreams for a better world, to write about their dreams for themselves or their families, or a list of ideas about what they would change in our world. Encourage students to share their ideas with the group by reading the finished product aloud. End the activity with a reading of Dr. King's "I Have a Dream" speech.

Letter to Dr. King

Help participants to generate their ideas for a letter by asking questions like, "What would you say to Dr. King if you could? Would you thank him? Would you ask him any questions? What would you tell him about yourself?" Younger students may choose to dictate a letter or draw a picture.

"Life most persistent and urgent question is: What are you doing for others?"

Dr. King asked this question in one of his speeches. Talk to the group about the importance of service to others. Ask them to make a list of the ways they help other people. It can be as simple as cleaning up your room or carrying a neighbor's groceries from the car to the front door. Remind the group about some of the projects done by people on the Greater Philadelphia Martin Luther King Day of Service: painting murals in schools, food and clothing drives, feeding the homeless, volunteering to be a reading coach to kids, and many others.
